

#### Dear children and families,

Please can I ask, that you ensure that your child does not arrive early at school. We have had a growing problem of children arriving from 8.20 onwards and then playing in our car park. Firstly, the car park is used until 8.30 when Mr Kingsford locks the gates. Prior to 8.45, there is no supervision at school for children unless they are in the Breakfast Club and I would like to ask that no other child arrives before 8.40. When they are here, we do expect them to line up and not run around the car park. We have had some near misses this week.

I understand that coming across the grass is a short cut, particularly when the queue has gone, but again please can I ask that everyone walks around the pathway. With the more inclement weather, the grass will quickly ruin and we will continue to have more mud walked through our school.

I have had some more questions about Christmas at school.









































#### **Attendance**
