

A big 'Thank you' to everyone who came along and supported our book fair. We sold a fantastic £304.57 worth of books which in turn gave as £81.83 in commission to spend on books for our library.

### **Library Re-launch**

We have been working really hard, in partnership with many different companies, revitalising and restocking our school library.

We have restocked the library with hundreds of new and up-to date books to ignite the children's interest and the library has been reorganised so that it has become a much more user friendly and exciting place for the children to visit.

We have been very grateful to the many companies and individuals that have supported us with completing this project:

- The Foyle Foundation gave our school an amazing grant of £4500 to purchase new books to suit every interest and every age group.
- The Science Park has donated more than 100 books to our library which were chosen by staff and children. We continue to work in partnership with them and feel incredibly grateful that they have chosen our school as one of their community projects.
- This half term, volunteers from Norfolk Children's Book Centre came and reorganised and catalogued the books on our shelves using their immense knowledge and passion for school libraries. It took four people three days of their own time, as the job was so big!
- Juliette Guiglion has been our wonderful school library volunteer this
  year. She has been such a support in helping to organise the library
  and ensure that it remains a lovely space so that children can use it.
   We have been so grateful for her ongoing commitment and help.
- The PTFA have generously given the school £500, which we have spent on a comfortable sofa (arriving soon) for the library and even more books.

### **Policy for supporting Children in school with Medical Conditions**

A Review of the Grove school 'Policy for supporting Children in school with medical conditions' has recently taken place in line with Public Health guidance September 2018.



The most significant change within our policy is the Diarrhoea and Vomiting guidelines which we have highlighted below.

Exclusion from school - Whilst symptomatic and until your child is fully clear of vomiting and diarrhoea.

Please keep your child away from school for <u>48 hours</u> after the last bout of vomiting or diarrhoea. Please ring the school office to notify us if you child is ill.

Seek further advice from your local health protection team if unsure.
