Dear Parents and carers,

Welcome to EYFS/Year 1 at The Grove. We hope you had an enjoyable and relaxing summer holidays. We have had a great first few days in class and are really enjoying getting to know all of your children. So far all the children have settled really well and they have been enjoying exploring their new classrooms and trying new learning challenges.

Please take time to look at the learning map on the other side of this letter which provides more information about what the children will be learning in different areas of the curriculum and gives an idea of how you could support them at home. If you would like further information or have any queries or concerns then please don't hesitate to speak to a member of the team.

Reading books will be sent out within the next week. Please read with your child every night if possible, even if only for 10 minutes. When you have read please make a note in the reading record book as this gives us an insight into reading patterns, behaviours and how the children are progressing.

We will also be sending home Common Exception words in a plastic wallet. These are both tricky words, which cannot be sounded out, and high frequency words. These need to be learnt by heart to improve reading fluency and give children a sight vocabulary which will give them confidence when tackling new texts. Please take the time to go over reading and writing these. This can be done in fun ways such as spotting in books or on signs, making with fridge magnets or using word cards to play snap.

The children will have PE on a Tuesday afternoon so please make sure kits are in school. We will be indoors for this session but it is useful to have a pair of trainers for outdoor use in case we choose to go outside.

We look forward to a year of exciting learning and fun experiences with the children.
