Our theme this term is... Storm Force!







As scientists we will:

Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object.

Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces.

Understand that force and motion can be transferred through mechanical devices such as gears, pulleys, levers and springs.

Planning different types of scientific enquires to answer questions, including recognising and controlling variables where necessary.

As geographers we will:

Learn about the position and significance of the tropical climatic zones (including the equator).

Understand how the tropical climate creates extreme weather systems, such as hurricanes, monsoons and tornadoes.

Use maps to identify the positions of the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn; Northern and Southern Hemispheres; lines of latitude and longitude, Artic and Antarctic circles and the Prime/Greenwich Meridian and time zones. Map the paths of storms from their start to end points and draw conclusions about weather patterns.

Understand how people living in the path of these weather systems adapt their environment to stand up to this extreme weather.

We will also be keeping an eye on live storms during the hurricane season on Newsround and in newspapers.

RE:

We will be learning about Generosity leading towards Harvest and considering more deeply the social and moral concepts inherent in Harvest.

PE:

Our indoor PE sessions will be on a Monday and will be Dance this half term. Outdoor PE will be on Wednesday lead by our PE coach.

As writers we will:

Explore the conventions of playscript writing, including dialogue, stage directions and how to convey action using an abridged version of Shakespeare's *The Tempest*.

Use relative clauses to begin sentences in a variety of interesting ways.

Improve their handwriting so that they write legibly and fluently with increasing speed.

As artists we will:

We will be taking inspiration from The Great Wave by Hokusai to create their own pieces using different printing techniques using different materials.

PSHE:

Our topic is 'Beginning and Belonging'. The children will be developing develop strategies for building collaborative relationships, a learning how to solve disputes successfully.

As mathematicians we will:

Deepen our understanding of place value, including understanding the place value of decimals. Use mental and written methods to solve calculations and solve problems involving addition and subtraction. Draw, measure and compare a range of angles, using this understanding to classify polygons.

As programmers we will:

Be working out how to debug and program games , as well as making a controller to play our games.

Music:

Year 5 will be having music lesson every Wednesday with a teacher from Cambridgeshire Music and will be having further musical appreciation lessons.
