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The Orchard – Booking and Costs

Should you need to use The Orchard, our before and after school club for your child, then you will need to register with our booking system 'Childcare Online Booking' (COB). Visit <u>https://the-grove-primary-school.childcare-online-booking.co.uk</u> to register your child/children. You can then log into your account, to book and pay for the sessions you require. All sessions <u>must</u> be booked in advance. For further information about sessions and how to book, please contact the school office.

Charges

The session fees are as follows:

Breakfast Club	£2.50
After school 3.15 – 5.00pm	£6.00
After school 3.15 – 6.00pm	£8.00

There will be an <u>additional £2 charge per child for any session not booked in advance</u> via the Childcare Online Booking System. The last collection time is 18:00. There will be a charge of £3.00 for each 5 minutes a child is not collected after this time to contribute to the overtime costs for staff.

Any cancellations made after 19:00 the day before will be charged in full for the session booked.

School Meals

Meals for Years 3 – 6 cost £2.25 per day.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a universal free school meal.

There is always a vegetarian option available followed by a dessert.

All school meals **must be paid for in advance** via SIMPay, unless your child is entitled to free school meals.

Knowledge Organiser Curriculum Newsletter

From this term, you will be receiving a new style curriculum newsletter known as a Knowledge Organiser. These will contain the key knowledge, vocabulary and questions that the children will be covering during their current topic. They are meant to be documents which are used throughout the topic, so your child will also have their own copy in their school books to look at during their learning. We hope that having a copy at home will give you the information you would like about what you child is learning in that topic and allow you to carry on the learning at home if you wish.
