Welcome! Keep up to date with what children at The Grove have been reading recently and what they recommend. In today's issue there are some of the Reading Gladiator's favourite books and some of Year 2's recommendations.

Genius Ideas (mostly), by Liz Pichon Recommended by Austin, Year 2

What's the book about? The book is about a boy called Tom Gates and loves doodling. He absolutely hates doing homework but he is nothing like Alvin from Alvin and the Chipmunks or Horrid Henry because he isn't naughty, in fact, he's actually very creative and imaginative. Tom Gates is very intelligent because the author describes and illustrates a 'smart meter' which shows just how smart he is. Also, Tom Gates tells a humorous story about having a family barbeque and his dad gets scared of a paper banger (if you don't know what that is, well, you'll just have to read it to find out (take a look at page 308/9!)).

Who would enjoy reading this? Children at The Grove who are free readers would enjoy reading this book, probably children in K52. A few people in Flamingo class have read this book, and others in its series, and we have really enjoyed discussing it and all the amusing anecdates which Tom narrates.

Why did you like it? I like this book because it's very creative. The front cover is pretty jazzy and looks good fun, but don't read a book by its cover, well... actually, the cover pretty much summarises what the book is like. Its colourful and funny and full of cartoons. One of my favourite features of the book is that at the bottom of each of the page's corners, there's a little bug which dances as an animation, like a flip-book. It's so cool.

Mermaids to the Rescue, by Lisa Ann Scott Recommended by Zari, Year 2
