#### **SECONDARY TRANSITIONS 2021 – NOW OPEN**

All year 6 parents can now start to apply for a Secondary School for next September. You need to have done this by the 31<sup>st</sup> October 2020. It is vitally important you complete this online form as without it your child will not be allocated a school place for Year 7. You will receive your offer on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2021. If you have any issues, please let the office know and we will do what we can to help you.
