Our theme this term is...

TURRETS & TIARAS



As **scientists** we will:

Continue with the theme of materials we will explore how the shapes of solid objects can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. The children will explore material properties making model houses for the 3 Little Pigs! We will revisit our work on seasonal change and compare Autumn and Winter with Spring .

As **geographers** we will:

- Develop our geographical skills and fieldwork.
- •Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the capital cities and surrounding seas and oceans.

As writers we will:

- Be looking at and performing a range of Spring poems and use these as inspiration to create our own poems.
- Developing our ability to write 'Golden Sentences' using full stops, capital letters, finger spaces and correct grammar (e.g. ran not runned)
- We will write a recount about our class trip to Mountfitchet Castle using time adverbs to sequence key events. (First, next, then, after that, finally etc.)

As mathematicians we will:

Explore measure (length, height, weight and mass) and solve problems related to this.

Calculate and solve addition and subtraction problems mentally, using number facts to support quick recall.

Learn to tell the time (o'clock, half past)

Developing our skills as digital artists through exploring and using a range of tools such as the different brushes, shapes and lines within a Paint package.

As **programmers** we will:

RE: We will be investigating and developing our understanding of the Christian Easter story to help us to consider the following; 'Why does Easter Matter to Christians?'

P.E: Outdoor we will be practising out throwing and catching skills with a range of equipment. Indoors we will be working on developing rolls in gymnastics.

PSHE: The PSHE unit this half term is 'me and my emotions.' Children will be learning to explore and talk about different feelings and we will share stories and have class discussions linked to this.

As artists we will:

- Complete our photo self-portraits, showing out character and what interests us.
- Design, make and evaluate our own castle in groups.

MUSIC: The children will be developing their thinking voice and keeping a pulse.

They will learn to recognise the sounds of a range of instruments and learning to play percussion musically.
