



On the menu this term...

We are learning about 'Our City' of Cambridge as part of our topic work. Lots of these tasks are open ended so the work can be guided by your child's thoughts and ideas. You can support or extend them when needed.

Starters

Science: Design and create a habitat for an animal of your choice. Think about what your animal will need to survive and be happy.

English: We have been reading lots of fairy-tales that have been re-told in an interesting way. Write your own re-telling of a fairy-tale. What strange thing might happen? Don't forget to use your neatest handwriting and maybe you could add some illustrations to your story.

Art: Look at some of the paintings created by Mondrian or Kandinsky. Can you create your own artwork inspired by them? You can use any media you wish; paints, card or even a computer!

Main Course

Maths: Find objects and put them in order of height. Can you measure them with a ruler? Can you work out the difference between the lengths? Try to present your findings as a labelled drawing.

DT: Cambridge has lots of famous buildings (such as Kings College Chapel, the Mathematical Bridge and St John's College). Build one of these famous Cambridge buildings. You could use lego, straws, junk modelling...

PSHE: Think about what makes you unique. What is your **identity**? Create a piece of art to show what makes you, you!

Geography: Create a presentation or poster about Cambridge. You might like to include information such as places to visit, maps of the city or photos. Be creative! For example, you could create a quiz to share with the class.

RE: We are learning about special events that Jews celebrate. Think about a special event that you have been a part of. What were you celebrating? How did it make you feel? You might want to bring in a photo to share with the class.

Reading: Create a wanted poster for an evil character from a book that you've recently read. What do they look like, what have they done and where were they last seen?
