

Dear parents and carers,

What an amazing start to a new academic year! The children look so smart in their school uniform and have settled back into their learning so quickly. As you walk around school there is that lovely buzz of learning and chatter.

We have published dates for class assemblies to go into your diaries. I am not 100% certain that we will be able to invite you to come in – it will depend on Local Authority and Public Health England advice as the months roll on. #### School uniform

When children are in school, they are part of a community and by wearing a uniform we aim to promote a feeling of equality, partnership and belonging. The school clothing is as follows:

- Black or grey skirts, pinafores or trousers
- White polo t-shirt with the school logo on or shirt
- Emerald Green sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo on
- Year 6 children may wear a plain white shirt and school tie
- Appropriate black footwear
- Plain black leggings may be worn under a school skirt or dress but should not be worn as a replacement for trousers.
- Hair should be tied back for school if it is below shoulder length.
- Children wear navy or black shorts and a T-shirt in their house colour for PE. Trainers are worn for outdoor P.E. Navy or black joggers and sweatshirts may be worn in colder weather.
