Our theme this term is...

Stone Age Britain!



As historians we will:

Learn about the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.

Use evidence to ask questions and find answers about the past.

Describe the characteristic features of the past, including experiences of men, women and children.

Explore the concept of change over time, representing this on a timeline.

Identify historical vocabulary and use it appropriately.



As scientists we will:

Recognise the importance of light in our daily lives, and the difference between natural and man-made light.

We will also be carrying out enquiries into different types of materials and find out which best reflect light rays and why.

We will be investigating into shadows, including patterns made when using an opaque object.

In RE we will:

This term we will be thinking about the Christian gospel and what kind of world Jesus wanted. We will consider why Jesus used stories to get his message across and what we can learn about Jesus from them.

In PE we will:

Dance : Look at different ways of moving, Explore shapes we can make with our bodies. Rehearse, perform and evaluate a dance sequence based on the Stone Age, set to music.

As readers and writers we will:

Read

Become increasingly independent as readers.

Learn to write letters, organising paragraphs around a theme. Develop and apply our knowledge and skills for instruction writing. Write our own version a familiar story, using a growing range of vocabulary.

As mathematicians we will:

Secure understanding of place value up to 10,000.

Apply understanding of place value in written and mental addition and subtraction. Including problem solving. Read and write numbers up to 2 decimal Describe and sort shapes and angles. Read write and convert time between the 12 and 24hour clocks.

As artists we will:

Explore the work of graffiti artists such as Kieth Haring, Thierry Noir and Stik. Look at links between Stone Age art and graffiti. Create own wall art inspired by research.

In **PSHE** we will:

Explore ground rules for the class. Learn how to access support and ways to help other people.

As programmers we will:

Predict ,investigate, modify and make code.

In music we will:

Develop our music interpretation skills. Sing , play percussion instruments and begin to compose..
