

Extreme reading letter

Dear Parents/Carers,

Happy New Year!

We hope that you had a happy winter break and are looking forward to the new term ahead. We were sad to say goodbye to some of our families at the end of last term and wish them well in their new homes and schools. Welcome to the new children and families who have joined us this term.

This term staff and governors will be working on the new school budget and as many of you will know Cambridgeshire has almost the lowest funding per child in the country. One of the ways we can increase our funding is through pupil premium. All children in Reception and KS1 are entitled to free school meals but pupil premium is different and has to be applied for; it supports families on low income and can be used for example to pay for music lessons, residential and day visits, 1:1 tuition. If you want to find out if you are eligible you can contact the Education Welfare Benefits Team for information about the benefits which support children financially while at school on 01223 703200 or email ewb.fsm@cambridgeshire.gov.uk.

You do not need to reapply if you are already receiving pupil premium. Even if your circumstances change the funding will continue to support your children for 6 years.

If you are receiving any of the eligible benefits listed below you can apply online for free school meals http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit but who are not entitled to working tax credit and whose annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) does not exceed £16,190
- Guarantee element of state pension credit
- Universal Tax Credit
