Our theme this term is...

The Rainforest



As Geographers we will:

Learn about the Amazon Rainforest:

- Use atlases and maps to locate countries which have a rainforest such as Brazil.
- Describe and understand the physical geography of the Amazon Rainforest such as the climate and the Amazon basin.
- Describe and explain the different layers of the rainforest and the reasons why specific animals which live in each layer.

As scientists we will:

- explore the living things within a habitat and discuss our thinking about them
- use classification keys to group organisms in a local and wider ecosystem
- evaluate environmental changes and their effects on organisms
- ask questions and plan a scientific enquiry to answer

As programmers we will:

- Enter and repeat LOGO commands to program an on-screen turtle so it draws shapes, patterns and pictures.
- Test, debug and improve programs with support.

RE: We will focus on developing an understanding of the Jewish concept of God. With a focus on Exodus, we will draw on the idea of God as a rescuer/protector/liberator/giver of freedom and all-powerful.

PE: Practice skills for volleyball including:

- -Learning to follow the rules of the game and play fairly
- -Develop simple tactics for attacking and defending.
- Develop skills for controlling a hockey ball using a hockey stick such as stopping the ball and passing.

As mathematicians we will:

Describe positions on a 2d grid as coordinates in the first quadrant. Recognise and show families of equivalent fractions using diagrams. Solve problems involving fractions. Secure our knowledge of written methods of addition and subtraction.

As designers we will:

Exploring real life shelters to be able to design and build a rainforest shelter.

PSHE

We will be learning about diversities and communities by exploring and celebrating similarities and differences between people in our community.

As writers we will:

Be reading the books 'The BFG' and 'The Vanishing Rainforest'. Using these key texts, we will develop our use of conjunctions and prepositions to show time. We will continue to secure our understanding of sentence structure by using a range of fronted adverbials and correctly punctuating them. We will also focus on drafting and writing narratives, editing and proofreading these and proposing changes to improve our work.

Kingfisher Swimming:

We will be taking part in weekly swimming lessons which will develop our confidence in the water to enable us to swim up to 25 metres.

We hope that you have all had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday. It has been lovely hearing about all of the many exciting things you have got up to. We have already started our new Geography topic, 'The Rainforest' and have begun reading the 'BFG' in Guided Reading and 'The Vanishing Rainforest' in English. The homework was presented to the class and the children were given an opportunity to give each other feedback.

We have sent home a new homework menu so please encourage your child to complete as many tasks as possible. If you need any resources, such as paper, to ensure that work is presented at a high standard then please ask your child's class teacher. Homework that is of an exceptional high quality will be put on display within the school as a good example to others.

Children will continue to receive weekly spelling and number fact homework. This will be set every Friday and will be due in the following Thursday. The homework must be brought back into school by Thursday ready to be tested on the same day.

So that each child can fulfil their potential we ask that you listen to your child read every night. We cannot stress the importance of reading and talking about what the text actually means alongside discussing unfamiliar vocabulary. If your child finds a piece of vocabulary they particularly like please encourage them to record on a piece of paper and bring it to school so that we can add it to our class vocabulary boards. This will improve their comprehension skills and quality of writing.
