On the menu this term...

We are learning about motor vehicles as part of our topic work. Lots of these tasks are open ended so the work can be guided by your child's thoughts and ideas. You can support or extend them when needed.

Starters

Art: Take a walk and observe for patterns found in nature. Can you design your own pattern? You can use any media you wish; paints, string, card or even on a computer!

Maths: Practice your partitioning work.
Choose a two digit number and partition it into the tens and the units. Think about representing the tens and units with items.
E.g. a pen is equal to 10 and a rubber is equal to 1, for example.

Geography: Create a presentation about a mode of transport (cars, motorbikes, planes, boats, etc.)
Your presentation could be saved on a memory stick and we can play it during show & tell.

Main Course

English: Write a free verse poem (doesn't have to rhyme) containing 3 stanzas. Try to include noun phrases in your poem. **Or** write a shape poem about and in the shape of something you are passionate about.

Maths: Create a number story. Choose a number and write as many different ways you can make that number. You may decide to add, including repeated addition, subtract, multiply and divide. You can write number sentences or draw pictures to represent it. Show your findings on a poster.

Speaking and listening:
Find a short film from the Literacy Shed. Form 5 questions about tone of the story as you watch it. Think about what you like about the narrative, what you don't like and make a prediction on what might happen after it has finished.

DT: Create a piece of art around a mode of transport. This can be a painting, a model or a sketch.
If you want to challenge yourself, you could try to make the ratios in proportion.
