



Our theme this week is...

Where We Live!

Starters

DT: Create a junk model of your dream home! Use old packaging or materials from the recycling to make a model of your house. Can you make the doors/ windows open and close? Don't forget to include a house number on the front!

Geography: Using a pencil and ruler make a map of your home. Can you draw the features of each room onto your map? Label each room and the features on your map. Try your map out— can you navigate yourself around your home?

Art: Create a furniture collage. Using old magazines and catalogues cut and stick or sort objects into the room they would belong to. Don't forget to give each room a title.

Main Course

Maths: Try some of the White Rose daily maths activities.

Practice counting up to and back from any number in 100. This can be done through playing Hide and Seek, starting at 20 and counting to 40 for example, or singing number songs and playing board games like Snakes and Ladders.

English: Can you find any books about where people live? The teachers in Year 1 love 'Sharing a Shell' by Julia Donaldson and 'Winnie the Witch' by Valerie Thomas.

Read the story of Hansel and Gretel (or watch on youtube). What makes the house appealing to the children?

Design your own fantasy house that is made of something strange. Is it an odd colour like Winnie's house, or is it made out of pasta!? Label what would be inside each room.

Computing: Find your house on Google Maps. Use Google Maps to look at your house from above and on street view. Use the arrows to move up and down the road around your area.

Science: Explore the textures around your house. Can you find something rough, smooth, bumpy. Make a list of the things you think are natural (like stones which are formed in nature) and things that are man-made (like bricks, which are made in a factory). Do any surprise you?

Other Activities:

Create a card game that is based around finding pairs of numbers to 20 that can be then be played with others at home. Create a dance routine to your favourite song and teach it to your family. Does everyone do the same dance or are there different parts?

Speaking and Listening:

Can you give someone directions when they have a blind-fold on? Get someone from your bed to your door by just giving them instructions. One step forward, turn and face left and so on.
